ECFMG Certification

Requirements

- Medical school meets ECFMG requirements
- Applicant passes USMLE Step 1, 2CK, and 2CS
- Primary-source verification of diploma and transcript with medical school
- Applicants screened against the Specially Designated Nationals List
 - Maintained by the Office of Foreign Assets Control of US Dept.
 of the Treasury
 - Includes terrorists and narcotics traffickers

Why Accreditation?



Accreditation is a process by which a designated authority reviews and evaluates an educational institution or program against a clearly defined set of standards.

Why Accreditation? Benefits

Interest of the second second

- Provides an opportunity to improve
- When voluntary, it enhances reputation
 - Increased student
 applications
 - Better retention of current students
 - Ease of student mobility

- When mandatory
 - o Required for
 - Continued funding
 - Graduates to be eligible for practice or further training
 - o Consequences
 - Time to improve
 - Closure







ECFMG Accreditation 2023 Initiative



ECFMG Accreditation 2023 Initiative Goals

- Catalyze international accreditation efforts
- Develop universally accepted standards for evaluating undergraduate medical education internationally
- Enhance quality of medical education
- Protect the public

ECFMG Accreditation 2023 Initiative ECFMG 2010 Board Resolution

Applicants for ECFMG Certification must graduate from a medical school that has been "appropriately accredited," and the accrediting agency must be "recognized."

Takes effect in 2023

"Accreditation 2023"



ECFMG Accreditation 2023 Initiative Milestones

- 2010—ECFMG announces requirement
- 2011—WFME launches pilot recognition process
- 2012—WFME approves *Programme for Recognition of Accreditation Agencies*
- 2012—WFME recognizes first accrediting agency

ECFMG Accreditation 2023 Initiative

FAIMER's Role in WFME *Recognition Programme*

- Assisted in developing standards, policies, and procedures and contributes to ongoing refinement
- Supported pilot
- Team secretary on recognition reviews
- Assists in training new WFME team members
- Collaborates to increase program capacity

ECFMG Accreditation 2023 Initiative

Phased Implementation

Phase 1 - 2018 ECFMG Web Resource to Help Students Make Better/More Informed Decisions on Medical School Selection

- Link to accrediting agencies recognized by WFME
- Link to NCFMEA listing of schools eligible for US federal loans
- "Tips" on selecting a medical school

Phase 2 - ~2020 World Directory Includes the Accreditation Status of the Medical School

 Medical schools that are accredited by an agency recognized by WFME will be annotated in the World Directory Phase 3 - ~2021 Student/Graduate Reports Include Information on the Accreditation Status of the Medical School

- Reports to residency programs, employers, state boards, and MRAs will include a statement on the accreditation status of the medical school. For example:
 - "This medical school was accredited in [year] by an agency recognized by WFME."

Phase 4 - 2023 Eligibility for Certification is Tied to the Accreditation Status of the Medical School

 ECFMG will only certify graduates from a medical school accredited by an agency recognized by WFME

ECFMG will provide regular updates to stakeholders.



WFME Recognition Programme



WFME Recognition Programme

- ONLY recognition program accepted by ECFMG to recognize accrediting agencies/meet ECFMG accreditation requirement
- FAIMER integral to developing *Programme*
- High level of confidence in *Programme* to meet goals of ECFMG's requirement

- 2012—Caribbean Accreditation Authority for Education in Medicine and other Health Professions (CAAM-HP)
- 2013—Association for Evaluation and Accreditation of Medical Education Programs, Turkey
- 2014—Liaison Committee on Medical Education (LCME, USA) and the Committee on Accreditation of Canadian Medical Schools (CACMS)
